When the current list of off-system bridge information is presented to the Parish by the LADOTD and has been reviewed and corrected as necessary, it will be transmitted to the LADOTD within thirty (30) days for bridge closures, load postings and quarterly reports, and on or before the required date set by LADOTD for LADOTD Bi-Annual computer reports.
